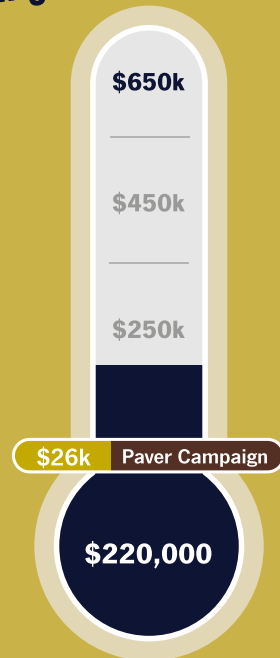

The City of Fort Collins Park Planning Department partnered with a community committee to imagine a 9/11 Memorial that would be both functional and reverent. The site at Spring Park was selected not only because of its proximity to Poudre Fire Authority Station #3, where firefighters can serve as guardians of the World Trade Center I-Beam; but also, because an existing Larch Tree is planted here. The Larch Tree offers a deeply symbolic element to the memorial in that it is a deciduous conifer that loses its needles in autumn and regrows them each spring. Symbolizing resilience and new life, the Larch Tree will root visitors to these values as they reflect.
